Objectives :

Forest are an important part of our survival on earth. Besides providing habitats for animals, the importance of forests cannot be emphasized any further : it gives us the clean air we breathe, the forest products (food, fuel, timber and paper) that we use in our daily lives. Forests' comprise Of 30% of the world's land surface and provides a bunch of ecosystem services-it protects watersheds, provides clean water, prevents soil erosion,absorbs greenhouse gases and is crucial for mitigating climate change. After oceans, forests are the world's largest store-house for carbon. In tropical forests alone, a quarter of a trillion tons of carbon is stored in above-and below-ground biomass. Forests are not only primary habitats for biodiversity conservation (>50% of world's land-based species live in the forests) but they also provide livelihood sources for humans. Over two billion people in this world rely on forests for their shelter, livelihood, water, food, and fuel security. 300 million people live in the forests, including 60 million indigenous people. Although humans recognize the crucial importance of forests,deforestation continues and only between 1990 and 2015 the world has already lost more than 130 million hectares of forest. What the Anthropocene fails to realize is that if the forest goes away, it's not just the trees that go away; the entire ecosystem falls apart and brings upon dire consequences that cannot be reverted or mitigated.

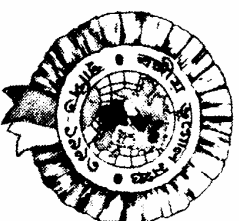
